Show Rules and Regulations

The Show shall be administered according to the following regulations.

Roses will be judged according to the NRSA standards as outlined in Judging Roses 2013.

Dahlias will be judged according to the DSA standards as outlined in Standards and Judging Rules of the Dahlia 1998.

Cut Flowers will be judged according to standards outlined in The Australian Horticultural Show & Judges Manual 2001.

Floral Arrangements will be judged according to standards as outlined in The Australian Floral Design Association Inc. Manual.

Regulations & Definitions

- All entries will be free.
- All blooms exhibited must be grown and staged by the exhibitor, except in the Floral Arrangements section.
- Once an exhibit has been staged it must not be moved or removed by another exhibitor. The Show Manager may supervise the movement of exhibits.
- All classes calling for multiple blooms will be deemed Not Necessarily Distinct unless specifically calling for otherwise.
- Stems of blooms must touch water.
- Stems will be counted at the level of the top of the container or the medium used to contain them.
- Exhibitors will be provided with pre numbered exhibit cards which should be
 placed face down at the front of the exhibit. An entry which does not have an
 exhibit card will not be judged.
- Exhibits should be correctly named where possible. If the name is not known the card should be marked "unknown". This does not apply to Floral Arrangement classes.
- All exhibits other than Floral Arrangements shall be staged in vases and bottles provided for the purpose.
- Exhibitors to collect Class Cards prior to staging from the Show Co-ordinator at the entry table
- **DISTINCT:** means different colours or cultivars. (Definitely Different)
- Multi Stem exhibits are to be staged in a single green vase (supplied) excepting the Novice Classes unless otherwise stated.
- Stem: A stem is defined as an original stem which carries a single bloom or bud.
- Cut: A cut is a stem that carries more than one bloom, and/or Bud/s

Nominations

Entries are open to all exhibitors and close with the Nomination Co-ordinator, Ian Frick by email ian.frick12@bigpond.com telephone 08 8563 0521, by 8.00pm on the Wednesday prior to the show.

There will be no limit to the number of entries per class an exhibitor may stage unless otherwise specified

Late entries will only be accepted should space become available.

Preparation and Staging

The Barossa Nursery will be available for preparation & staging from 12pm and will cease at 9.00pm on the day prior to the show. The hall will reopen at 7.00am on Saturday morning. Judging will commence at 10.00am. The exhibition will be dismantled at 5.00pm on Sunday at which time exhibits can be removed.

 Rose Society of S.A. Exhibitors.
- Novice Section: This section is for exhibitors who have <u>NOT</u> won 2 'Novice Championship' Awards or higher in the Barossa Rose and Flower Show.
- Exhibitors who have previously entered in a Rose Society of S.A Inc.
 Competition are <u>INELIGIBLE</u> to be classed as a Novice
