Include name(s) of the exhibitor(s) and class numbers to be entered. List your entry class numbers as follows e.g. 2,5,5,6,19. Separate class number with a comma and repeat the class number for each of a multiple entry set. Only 1 entry per exhibitor for class 1, 2 and 3. No limit for other classes.

Saturday 9th April

- 7:30 - 8:15 Hall set up. *Assistance needed*. Benches , covers for benches, approximate class areas, class information cards and class number on stand to be completed.
- 8:15 -10:00 Exhibitors Prepare Exhibits and *place into the space for the class with a completed entry slip*. Each container in the State Championship classes should be exhibited with a separate 'entry slip'.
- 10:00 - 10:30 Show manager and exhibitors present exhibits to fill space more evenly for all benches.
- 10:30 - 11:00 Judging. After Judging remove and pack away Class numbers and Stands. Distribute prize and championship tickets to winning exhibits.
- 4:30. Hall closed to public, cleared and gardens vacated by 5:00.

Sunday 10th April

- 9:30 - 10:00 Noel Lothian exhibits watered/refreshed. *Assistance needed*.
- 10:00. Public entry to Noel Lothian Hall
- 10:30 Talks re rose culture in the garden will commence when enough interested parties are present.
- 4:00 Hall closed to public, cleared, Rose Auction, Pod packed and gardens vacated. by 5:00 *Assistance needed*.

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Notes : Exhibitors are asked to bring old towels to clean up spilt water and to leave the set-up area neat, clean, dry and tidy.
Each entry must be exhibited with a completed 'entry slip' available from the administration desk.

Section 1 : SHOW RULES and REGULATIONS

The Show shall be administered according to the following regulations and judged in accordance with The National Rose Society of Australia (NRSA) rules and standards as set out in the NRSA handbook, *Judging Roses 2013*, copies of which are available from the Secretary.

Modern Roses 12, 2016 Official List of Approved Exhibition Names for Exhibitors and Judges and *The Official Registry and Checklist 2nd Edition - ROSA* are used to determine the description and type of a particular cultivar where listed. Those not listed are considered eligible at the judge's discretion.

REGULATIONS

1. All entries are free.
2. All blooms exhibited must be grown and staged by the exhibitor, **except** in the floral arrangement classes.
3. Once an exhibit has been staged it must not be moved or removed by another exhibitor. The Chief Judge, the Chief Steward or their delegate may supervise the movement of exhibits.
4. In classes calling for distinct varieties, the showing of duplicates either under the same name or under a different name, will disqualify the exhibit.
5. Stems or blooms must touch water.
6. Stems will be counted at the level of the top of the container or the medium used to contain them.
7. An exhibit in which an artificial aid is employed will be disqualified, except, if an exhibitor leaves a pellet in the exhibit the judge shall endorse the exhibitor's card and the exhibit will then be judged. Two (2) points for each pellet discovered will be deducted as a penalty.
8. Wiring is only permitted in the Exhibition Classes.
9. Exhibitors must obtain their entry cards or exhibit slips from the Administration desk. Each card is marked with a class code and their exhibitor code. These cards must be placed in front of the exhibit face downwards. Care should be exercised in the correct placement of these cards. If they are omitted the judge **will not** consider the exhibit. *Each container in the State Championship classes should be exhibited with a separate 'entry slip'.*
10. All blooms should be correctly named and the names should be written on the upturned side of the exhibit card. Omission of the name or incorrect naming will not disqualify an exhibit, except where this results in duplication (clause 4). One (1) point will be deducted where it appears that no attempt has been made to name exhibits. When the name is not known, the exhibit should be marked 'unknown'. The above does not apply to floral arrangement and student classes.
11. Unless express approval of the Chief Judge or the Chief Steward has been obtained **no exhibit** will be removed from the bench until after the Show has been declared closed.
12. Protests must be lodged by 2pm on the day of the Show Judging with the Show Manager who will refer all protests received to the Chief Judge.
If he/she considers the protest justified, a meeting of at least three (3) members of the Show Committee will consider the protest and their decision will be final.
13. Roses classified as Grandiflora may be staged in classes which specify either Hybrid Tea or Floribunda.
Miniflora roses can only be shown in classes calling for Miniflora varieties unless the class details make Miniflora's acceptable.
14. All exhibits in 'Cut Flowers', except where specified, must be staged in the Society's containers.
15. All exhibits to be staged separately, unless otherwise specified.

EXPLANATION OF TERMS USED IN THIS SCHEDULE

A Stem is defined as an original new growth which carries *one bloom or one bud* and has received no check from pinching, stopping or pruning from the time of starting into growth to flowering.

Disbudding is not regarded as a check to growth under this definition. The stem should be proportionate in thickness and length to the size of the bloom it supports. **Anything else is a cut**, as defined below.

A Cut is similar to a stem (original new growth) that carries a bloom **and** a bud or buds, **or**, more than one bloom, **and/or** bud or buds.

A Bud is the unexpanded stage of a rose flower with no petals unfurling. In a 'Bud to Full Bloom' exhibit (*Multistage* classes), colour must be showing.

A Bloom is defined as the expanded stage of a rose flower.

NND means Not Necessarily Distinct cultivars, i.e. they can be all the same variety, all different varieties or a combination of same and different varieties.

Stems or Cuts means the exhibit could be any combination of stem(s) and/or cut(s).

Open Class. Open to all exhibitors.

NOMINATIONS

Members of Societies affiliated with the NRSA Inc. and The Rose Society of SouthAustralia Inc. (RSSA) and school students are eligible to enter in all sections, except where specified.

Entries accepted up to Wednesday Evening 9:00 pm 6th April. preceding the Show.

Only 1 entry per exhibitor for class 1, 2 and 3. No limit for other classes.

Members will not be penalised if they cannot stage the entries nominated but it would be appreciated if the nominations secretary was informed of the withdrawals as this allows space for other exhibitors to enter i.e. **late entries will be accepted in sections if sufficient space is available.**

Under no circumstances will alterations or late entries be accepted in the 'Cuts Sections' after 9:00 am on the Saturday morning of the show.

Please use the following format. The class number then a comma, repeat the class number if more than one entry is to be made for a class. (No spaces)

PREPARATION AND STAGING

The hall will be available for preparation on Saturday from **8:15am** on the Saturday morning of the Show. It is anticipated that assistance will be available to exhibitors to transport exhibits from the car park to the hall.

Staging of exhibits in all classes must be completed by **10:00 am** on the Saturday of the Show. Clearing of the work space used should also be done by the exhibitor by **10:00 am**. Exhibitors are expected to remove their own rubbish and excess blooms and to leave their area neat, clean tidy and dry. **10:00am** judges and stewards will be given preliminary instructions before commencing to judge.

Exhibitors entering the Hall during judging without the permission of the Chief Judge may be disqualified from any prizes to which they are entitled.

PRIZE MONEY

*Exhibitors prize money will only be transferred to a **BSB and account number by the Treasurer.** (i.e. no cash payments will be made). Exhibitors are requested to submit this detail with their entries **or** emailed or given to the Treasurer before prize money is transferred.*

Notes for Class 1, 2 and 3.

Each stem or cut is to be identified with the name of the variety and the section it represents, for example, Full Bloom, Miniature etc. Each is to be staged in a separate container and each should be exhibited with a separate 'entry slip'.

A Grade Classes (4 to 15)

4. 1 stem Large Flowered Rose (Exhibiton, Decorative, Full Bloom and Shrub types.)
5. 1 cut Large Flowered Rose (Floribunda or Shrub types)
6. 1 stem Miniature, Miniflora or Polyantha.
7. 1 cut Miniature, Miniflora or Polyantha.
8. 3 stems, large flowered roses NND any type to be staged in 1 vase
9. 3 cuts, large flowered roses NND any type to be staged in 1 vase
10. 3 stems, polyantha, miniature or miniflora roses NND to be staged in 1 vase
11. 3 cuts, polyantha, miniature or miniflora roses NND to be staged in 1 vase
12. 3 or 4 stems, one variety, any type demonstrating all stages of development including a bud and a full bloom to be staged in 1 vase
13. 4-6 stems or cuts, NND any type to be staged in 1 vase
14. 6-12 stems or cuts, NND any type to be staged in 1 bowl
15. Over 12 stems and/or cuts, one variety, any type demonstrating all stages of development including bud and full bloom to be staged in 1 vase.

B Grade Classes (16 to 23)

16. 1 stem Large Flowered Rose (Exhibiton, Decorative, Full Bloom and Shrub types.)
17. 1 cut Large Flowered Rose (Floribunda or Shrub types)
18. 1 stem Miniature, Miniflora or Polyantha.
19. 1 cut Miniature, Miniflora or Polyantha.
20. 3 stems and/or cuts, NND large flowered roses any type to be staged in 1 vase
21. 3 stems, polyantha, miniature or miniflora roses NND to be staged in 1 vase
22. 3 or 4 stems, one variety, any type demonstrating all stages of development including a bud and a full bloom to be staged in 1 vase
23. 4-6 stems or cuts, NND any type to be staged in 1 vase

C Grade Classes (24 - 26)

24. 3 stems and/or cuts, NND any type to be staged in 1 vase
25. 4-6 stems or cuts, NND any type to be staged in 1 vase
26. 1 rose, any type to be staged in a bottle

Open Grade Classes (27 to 29)

27. 3 stems and/or cuts, NND Australian Bred roses any type to be staged in 1 vase.
28. 3 stems and/or cuts, NND Roses introduced prior to 1900 to be staged in 1 vase.
29. 9 stems and/or cuts, NND any type to be staged in 3 vases, 3 in each.

Section 3 : Floral Arrangements

General Information

See **Section 1** for the 'Show Rules and Regulations'.

This section is open for general entry by members of the Rose Society of South Australia Inc. or of affiliated Societies.

Affiliated club's members should enter according to their level in A or B grade.

Roses, other flowers and foliage need not have been grown by the exhibitor, but exhibitors must supply their own containers and accessories. Driftwood and dried material are permitted unless otherwise specified.

NB : 1. No artificial flowers allowed except where stated.

2. At least one rose in each arrangement.

3. Definitions and standards as prescribed in 'The Australian Floral Design Association Inc. Manual' will apply to the judging of these classes.

4. **Arrangements, once placed on the show bench, may be moved only by or under the supervision of the Show Secretary.**

5. Exhibitors are allowed up to 3 exhibits per class.

Except where specified the allotted table space for all exhibitors will be 60 cm. x 60 cm. x 120 cm. high. Exhibitors to inform the Nominations Secretary if a larger size up to a maximum of 90 cm. x 60 cm. x 120 cm. high is required.

Classification of Exhibitors for Floral Arranging

RSSA Inc. members not classified as A or B grade exhibitors are entitled to exhibit in **C Grade** or any other grade they desire.

Any affiliated club member rated at intermediate level or above should exhibit in A-grade classes.

Floral Arrangement Trophies

David Ruston Perpetual Trophy

Awarded to the exhibitor of the Grand Champion Floral Arrangement.

A Grade Floral Arrangement Champion Trophy

Awarded to the exhibitor of the champion A grade floral arrangement.

B Grade Floral Arrangement Champion Trophy

Awarded to the exhibitor of the champion B grade floral arrangement.

C Grade Floral Arrangement Champion Trophy

Awarded to the exhibitor of the champion C grade floral arrangement.
